# **Future Skills Questionnaire Case Study**

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## Future Skills Questionnaire - delivering a joined-up approach

After participating in Compass+ training in her local Careers Hub, Hannah made the decision to roll out FSQ with her more able Year 11 and Post 16 SEND learners. The results gathered are vitally important for learner's EHCPs, Hannah trained her teaching colleagues on fundamental aspects of the Future Skills Questionnaire, including how it captures learner voice and how this can be used to further support learners achieve their best next step.

## What impact has FSQ had on both the learners and the school?

Adopting the innovative approach of sharing questionnaire results in learners EHCPs has given further purpose to the quality and visibility of careers education in Hannah's school. It has allowed the school to tailor greater support towards encouraging learners to make well-informed decisions, helping them to consider which Post 18 route might be the best fit for them.

### How has the Future Skills Questionnaire been delivered?

Individual teachers sit with learners to complete the questionnaire. Often learners find it challenging to complete the questionnaire in one sitting. As such, Hannah gives learners a short break halfway through. This allows learners to refocus on the questions and provide the insight needed to select the most appropriate response.

### Wider Compass+ usage

Hannah fully utilises the User Management function in Compass+, giving all teachers 'Edit' permissions so they can add their own careers activities to the product throughout the year. This has empowered teachers to take ownership of the activities that they deliver and has contributed towards a whole-school approach to careers. Teachers have also become more confident in using Compass+ and feel more capable to effectively deliver FSQ with learners.
