The Future Skills Questionnaire is a tool to measure learners' career-readiness. FSQ covers key aspects of knowledge, skills and attitudes that are important for successful transitions.

- The questionnaire takes about 10 minutes to complete. There are no right or wrong answers so please answer the questions as honestly as you can.
- There are two sections to the questionnaire, the first on your career knowledge and skills and the second on essential skills for life and work.
- Your data will be processed in line with the Future Skills Questionnaire privacy notice which tells you why and how your personal information is processed.
