The Future Skills Questionnaire is a tool to measure learners' career-readiness. FSQ covers key aspects of knowledge, skills and attitudes that are important for successful transitions.

- Your responses will be viewed by your schools Careers Leader to help shape and evaluate your career programme and make sure that you are supported to make informed choices about your next steps after school or college.
- The questionnaire takes about 10 minutes to complete. There are no right or wrong answers so please answer the questions as honestly as you can.
- There are three sections to the questionnaire, the first on your career knowledge and skills, the second on essential skills for life and work and the third on career planning.
- Your data will be processed in line with the Future Skills Questionnaire privacy notice which tells you why and how your personal information is processed.
